Aronia *Aronia melanocarpa*

Hardy deciduous shrub up to 8 feet tall. Very high antioxidant levels, and high in pectin, minerals and flavanoids. Use berries for juice and leaves for tea.

Currant, Boskoop Giant *Ribes Nigrum*

Productive hardy shrub with large nutritious sweet-tart black berries. Partially self-fertile.

Currant, Laxtons Giant *Ribes Nigrum*

Productive shrub with larger nutritious sweet-tart black berries. Self-fertile, disease and frost-resistant.

Elderberry, American Black *Sambucus canadensis*

Self-fertile, fruiting deciduous shrub, grows up to 15 ft with a beautiful multistem thicket forming structure. Useful as mid-story layer in polyculture tree planting designs. Flower sets ripen into large clusters of nutritious iridescent black berries.

Elderberry, Blue *Sambucus caerulea*

Self fertile, fast growing native shrub. Provides flowers fruit and multi species wildlife habitat

Elderberry, Bob Gordon *Sambucus canadensis*

American Elderberry cultivar known for its large, sweet-tart berries, high yields, and ease of harvest. Popular for jellies, wines, and syrups. Partially self-fertile.

Goumi Berry *Elaeagnus multiflora*

Deciduous medium sized shrub grown for its nutrient dense fruits and nitrogen fixation properties.

Honeyberry, Indigo Gem *Elaeagnus multiflora*

Hardy, fast growing productive shrub. Produces early season berries high in vitamin C.

Jostaberry *Lonicera caerulea*

Productive Self-fertile shrub. Reddish-black fruit with the tartness of a gooseberry and the rich sweetness of a blackcurrant.

Ninebark *Physocarpus*

Native deciduous 3-10 foot tall shrub with attractive foliage, exfoliating bark and flower clusters for pollinators and seeds for birds

Raspberry, Munger Black *Rubus occidentalis*

A leading PNW variety. Large plump black berries with a sweet rich flavor. Highly productive & cold hardy.

16**Seaberry Seedling, Maldovan** *Hippophae ramnoides*

Nitrogen fixing shrub that produces tart bright orange berries rich in nutrients. Berries are coveted for their skin-healing and anti-inflammatory properties.

12**Spirea** *Spiraea douglasii*

Oregon native 3-7 ft deciduous shrub with deep pink flower clusters. Thrives in wet areas.

8**Twinberry** *Lonicera involucrata*

A large hardy PNW native deciduous ornamental honeysuckle shrub with yellow to orange-red flowers and shiny black berries - for birds (but not people). Used for restoration projects in moist areas.

14**TREES****Apple, Ashmeads Kernal** *Malus domestica*

Late season ripening medium sized russeted apple. Known for its sharp, nutty and sweet champagne-like flavor. Great for fresh eating and cider

25**Apple, Dayton** *Malus domestica*

Early season red apple. Sweet and crispy with high disease resistance.

25**Apple, Golden Russet** *Malus domestica*

Late season ripening medium sized apple. Known for its sweet nutty flavor and dense flesh. Great for fresh eating and juicing, excellent storage apple

25**Apple, Granny Smith** *Malus domestica*

Late ripening, large vibrant green apple, tart tangy flavor holds up well to cooking as well as fresh eating. Good storage life.

25**Apple, Holstein** *Malus domestica*

Mid season all purpose apple. Very good storage and disease resistance. Complex sweet tart taste, thought to be of Cox Orange Pippin parentage

25**Apple, Hudsons Golden Gem** *Malus domestica*

Mid/late season ripening apple with nutty pear-like flavor and elongated russeted appearance. Disease resistant, seedling found in Tangent OR

25**Apple, Jonagold** *Malus domestica*

Mid/late heavy cropping sweet-tart dessert apple

25**Apple, Karmijn** *Malus domestica*

Mid season apple with intense sweet tart flavor and dense flesh. Parentage Cox Orange Pippin and Jonathan.

Apple, Liberty <i>Malus domestica</i>	25
<i>Mid season apple known for its disease resistance, deep red color, and crisp sweet/tart taste. One of the best apples for beginner growers.</i>	
Apple, Red Gravenstein <i>Malus domestica</i>	25
<i>Early ripening apple, similar to Gravenstein but sweeter with a deep red skin. All purpose apple, great for fresh eating, cooking, and cider.</i>	
Apple, RubINETTE <i>Malus domestica</i>	25
<i>Late season medium-small apple, complex flavor. Considered one of the best tasting dessert apples.</i>	
Apple, Williams Pride <i>Malus domestica</i>	25
<i>Early ripening deep red apple with a rich sweet tart spiced flavor. Excellent disease resistance. Long bloom time, good pollinator</i>	
Apple, Wynoochee <i>Malus domestica</i>	25
<i>Large flavorful early season apple with high disease resistance and good storage properties.</i>	
Cascara <i>Frangula purshiana</i>	20
<i>Hardy, adaptable native great for wildlife and hedgerow applications.</i>	
Chestnut, Monsol <i>C. sativa x crenata</i>	20
<i>Productive mid-season cross</i>	
Chestnut, Precoce Migoule <i>C. sativa x crenata</i>	20
<i>Productive cross with good pollination properties</i>	
Chestnut, Silverleaf <i>C. crenata</i>	20
<i>Good pollinator, produces large, dark brown seed</i>	
Linden, Little Leaf <i>Tilia cordata</i>	25
<i>Elegant deciduous tree, reaching 50-70 feet, with a lush, heart-shaped vibrant yellow canopy in fall. Creamy-yellow summer blooms attract pollinators.</i>	
Mimosa <i>Albizia julibrissin</i>	12
<i>Also known as The Happiness Tree with uplifting medicinal effects, and pink blossoms for pollinators.</i>	
Pawpaw <i>Asimina triloba</i>	30
<i>Largest edible North American native fruit. A great understory tree, does well in semi-shade and slightly acidic soils. From Peaceful Heritage Ultra-Select seed.</i>	
Quaking Aspen <i>Pouulus tremuloides</i>	25
<i>Fast growing up to 60' with white bark and leaves that tremble in the breeze and turn bright yellow in the fall. Bark has been used medicinally.</i>	
Toon <i>Toona sinensis</i>	12
<i>Aka Beef and Onion Tree. Shoots and young leaves used for stir fry. Fast growing up to 80 feet, or pruned to produce more shoots. Mahogany family with valuable lumber.</i>
